“HERE AM I! SEND ME.”

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His robe filled the temple. Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one cried to another and said: “Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!”
Isaiah 6:1-3

Americans applauded the ‘Miracle on the Hudson.’ It was an incredible rescue! The scripture “*Before they ask I will answer*” happened! Every detail came together and changed what could have been a horrendous airplane crash into an extraordinary ‘splash.’

Peter Greenberg (NBC News Contributor) cited the amazing factors that came together for this spectacular landing and rescue. EXPERIENCE: The pilot ‘Sully’ Sullenberger III was a former jet pilot who also operates a safety consulting firm. When a flock of birds disabled both engines, he managed to guide and safely land his Airbus on the Hudson River. Even the traffic controller had 20 years experience.

TIMING was another key factor to their success—food carts weren’t in the way, passengers still strapped in, and it was daylight. WEATHER was in their favor—“there were no winds or waves.” LOCATION “made Jan. 15 a very lucky day for 155 people—the fact that the pilot decided on a water landing” was another. The maritime traffic meant “there were lots of boats nearby to act as first responders” for evacuating the passengers.

God’s fingerprints are all over the success of this landing. “There are just so many variables that could have taken place” but didn’t that day. Even the fact that the attendant tried to open the back door and it wouldn’t budge. “This was actually fortunate, because if the door had opened, experts say the plane would have sunk fast. Instead what happened turned into part of the miracle: the flight attendant began ushering her passengers forward.”

“What’s even more extraordinary” said Greenburg “is that this time, instead of only looking at what went wrong, air accident investigators will also be studying what went right. Because plenty did, beginning with the pilot’s actions.”

=Synchronicity

Synchronicity is the orchestration of events beyond our understanding, comprehension or control. It's the combination of events happening at the same time and unfolding together without any apparent underlying connection. Synchronicity is God working everything out together for our good.

When you recognize synchronicity in your life, you open yourself to receive Divine Intervention—you're seeing the hand of Providence in operation.

Regardless of how random events seem, there's always a reason for what's happening. Nothing is random in this delicately ordered Universe—including its seeming chaos. There's a rhyme and a reason to it, a Divine order that's always at work.

=Nothing Happens Randomly

Even if we are all alone and cast into the midst of the sea—God's able to work out the miraculous details for recovery. It happened to William Tole, a 19 year old navy seaman washed overboard from his carrier without a life jacket and far off the coast of Africa. His chances weren't good to be rescued—at 4 AM no one was awake to see what happened.

Tole didn't panic. First he made a life preserver out of his pants. Thinking it would be 8 AM before he'd be missed and a search party sent out—he tried to sleep. Although morning came and went and no planes circled for him, he kept praying, "Please God, let me be rescued." Never once did he say, "What's the use" or give up his vigilance for God's rescue.

At 3 PM a sailor on an American freighter spotted and rescued him. The captain couldn't explain why he changed from his usual course off the coast of Africa to a Spanish course—but if he hadn't the young man would have gone unnoticed several hundred miles away.

Our greatest miracles often happen while waiting on God—we've done our best and God intervenes to do the impossible! "*With God All Things are Possible.*"

=Divine Providence

Oh, that I knew where I might find Him that I might come to His seat! ... Look I go forward, but He is not there, and backward, but I cannot perceive Him; when He works on the left hand, I cannot behold Him; when He turns to the right hand, I cannot see Him. But He knows the way that I take; when He has tested me, I shall come forth as gold.

JOB 23

Just as this young seaman was on God's radar screen—you also can't get out of His sight. Think of it—God has a freight liner change course and spot the seaman in the midst of a vast ocean! You can't be lost! There's not even a hair that falls from your head without it showing up on some heavenly tally sheet!

The answer finds you if you keep your faith directed towards your goal. Your faith must be positive, expectant, unwavering and utterly sincere so it'll energize the creative power within. Faith activates what you've pictured in your mind's eye much like a radio antenna attracts sound waves—what you want finds you.

Never dictate God's time frame or manifestation. Synchronicity means God knows what you need and will manifest it in the moment you need it. This young man didn't tell God what to do—but he did put his mind and heart in a place to be found. He was open to divine intervention. He did what he could do by making the floating device and staying calm—then he patiently waited eleven hours necessary to synchronize all the elements of his rescue.

=”Here Am I! Send Me.”

And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke, so I said: “Woe to me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.” Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal which he had taken with the tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth with it, and said: “Behold, this has touched your lips; Your iniquity is taken away, and your sin is purged.” Also I heard the voice of the LORD saying: “Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?” Then I said, “Here am I! Send me.”

ISAIAH 6: 4-8

In a vision Isaiah saw the Shekinah Glory in the Heavenly Tabernacle of God and heard a voice that caused the posts of the doors to shake. It's the shifting in the structure of the House that led to his OPPORTUNITY in the supernatural. First he felt an unraveling of everything he ever deemed important—so much so that he felt unworthy for even being there. Until the angel of the Lord purged his mouth of all his doubtful, negative, destructive words and turned his testimony into a sacrifice of praise. Now he's through thinking why he can't do it, or what's wrong with him—why God can't use him or why this can't be true. Isaiah believes it's of God. Everything changes. He thinks differently—he's a new man.

Isaiah hears the voice of OPPORTUNITY. Without hesitation he rises to come forward and speaks, “Here am I! Send me.” He takes the forward initiative of believing he can do it. Isaiah believed the EXPERIENCE prepared him to speak and he was ready to do it. He reached for the opportunity. You likewise are purged, and your hearts and minds stand at attention—you move forward to meet Him in the air—to become one with Him in purpose—to make His plan happen through you.

=Spirit of Attention

The literal act of standing up when you sing a song moves you into another realm of possibility. It's a mere act of participation yet it becomes a forward initiative that speaks volumes. You become a testimony of change. Let me illustrate how this works: Recently I was at a vacant house with a lock box that wouldn't open. In sub-zero weather the realtor reworked the combination again and again. As I prayed I saw the numbers stand up ... so I prayed that as he pressed the numbers of the combination, the mechanized numbers would come to meet him—and they did. It opened immediately.

It's similar to the Patriarch Jacob responding “Here I am” to the Angel of God who spoke to him in a dream and commanded him to lift his eyes to “see all the rams which leaped on the flocks were streaked, speckled, and gray-spotted.” Jacob believed God. Consequently he stood up a symbol of what he saw happen in his dream. He cut special rods with white strips and set the rods before the stronger of the flocks so they might conceive as they came to drink—fully expecting to yield a streaked, speckled and spotted flock when as yet there were

none to be found—and it happened. Jacob recognized the hand of Providence and welcomed the opportunity to prosper financially.

When the young seaman said “Please God, let me be rescued!” he was putting out a flag to be spotted. If you ask God to rescue you from your situation, you likewise put a flag out to be spotted by the Redeemer. You reach towards the answer or come forward to embrace what’s meeting you head on. You believe God does the impossible and step forward in Him—you come face to face with God in your moment of decision.

Can you see the same thing happening as you raise your hands to God or stand up? Your Spirit man comes to attention because you sensitize yourself to the move of the Spirit. When the young seaman said over and over “Please God, let me be rescued,” he was positioning himself to be redeemed. He was convinced that God was able to save him and expected the manifestation of it at any moment. He BELIEVED God was able to save him from a hopeless situation.

=Make It Happen

Until one is committed, there is hesitancy, the chance to draw back, always ineffectiveness. Concerning all acts of initiative (and creation), there is one elementary truth the ignorance of which kills countless ideas and splendid plans: that the moment one definitely commits oneself, then providence moves too. A whole stream of events issues from the decision, raising in one's favor all manner of unforeseen incidents, meetings and material assistance, which no man could have dreamt would have come his way. W.H. Murray

Sometimes we need to do something to make it happen. That’s what the experienced pilot Sullenberger did. Experience means he’s been in situations before and learned valuable lessons. Along with experience comes the ability to ‘not panic’—to trust in that inner sense that we know is God. Sullenberger didn’t wait for someone else to save him because this was what he trained for—so he did his best. He later would say he felt his whole life was in training for this moment.

We applaud his courage. Thank God the pilot was experienced. His inner knowledge of “I can do this” is another way of saying, “*Here am I! Send me!*” It’s sensing and acting—believing that “*I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.*”

Never stop believing in Divine Intervention! Miracles happen! And if you’re in a situation ... consider how you can come forward ... what you can offer—it’s saying “Here am I! Send me!” God often ‘saves the day’ through man’s willingness to act.

You are empowered to do amazing exploits for God. Your experiences train you. If you recognize the moment you also are able to walk in the synchronicity of unfolding events saying, “Here am I! Send me.” Great things happen the moment you commit yourself to do the work—then Providence moves in extraordinary ways to bring it to pass!
